

National Wear Red Day - February 2, 2018

Five numbers that all women should know to take control of their heart health are: Total Cholesterol, HDL (good) Cholesterol, Blood Pressure, Blood Sugar and Body Mass Index (BMI). WOMEN FACE HIGHER RISK OF STROKE

NEW GUIDELINE OFFERS WAYS TO LOWER YOUR RISK

WOMEN HAVE MORE STROKES THAN MEN, AND STROKE KILLS MORE WOMEN THAN MEN.

Talk to your healthcare provider about how to lower your risk, using the below information from the new American Heart Association/American Stroke Association prevention guidelines.

Stroke RISK GOES UP due to ...

- PREGNANCY + PREECLAMPSIA**: About 3 out of 10,000 pregnant women have a stroke during pregnancy compared to 2 out of 10,000 young women who are not pregnant.
- BIRTH CONTROL PILLS**: May double the risk of stroke, especially in women with high blood pressure.
- HORMONE REPLACEMENT THERAPY**: Once thought to lower stroke risk, this in fact increases the risk.
- MIGRAINES WITH AURA + SMOKING**: Strokes are more common in women with migraines with aura who also smoke.
- ATRIAL FIBRILLATION**: Quadruples stroke risk and is more common in women than men after age 75.

LOWER YOUR RISK for stroke by...

- Pregnant women with very high blood pressure should be treated with safe blood pressure medications.
- Talk to your healthcare provider about whether you should follow the guideline recommendation of low-dose aspirin starting in the second trimester (week 12) to lower preeclampsia risk.
- Women should be screened for high blood pressure before taking birth control pills. Women should not smoke, and they should also be aware that smoking and the use of oral contraceptives increases the risk of stroke.
- Hormone replacement therapy should not be used to prevent stroke in postmenopausal women.
- Smokers who have migraines with aura should quit to avoid higher stroke risk.
- All women over age 75 should be screened for atrial fibrillation.

Bits and Pieces

"TIP Cards"

The Granite School District Educational Technology Department has created "TIP Cards" – Technology Integration Progress Cards. The cards are a quick desk reference, which provide instructions and tips for classroom technology tools and digital learning resources. While the cards are designed to be used by teachers, some of the information is helpful for all employees. Below are a couple of the tips. You can access the entire set of cards as well as additional resources at edtech.fun.

Suggestions for Creating and Keeping Passwords Secure

- Do not give your password out to anyone. If you do write your passwords down (though not suggested), keep the list in a secure place.
- Do not use a solitary word, derivative of your name, or a name of a family member or pet.
- Begin with a phrase and condense it or change letters to other characters in a way that makes it unique but memorable to you.
- Use a unique password for different accounts.



Information and Media Literacy

An important component of information literacy is the ability to critically evaluate information we have found to determine whether it is credible and accurate. Kathy Schrock's 5 Ws of Website Evaluation (www.schrockguide.net) provides an easy way to start evaluating the information encountered online.

Who is the author and are they an expert? Is a biography of the author included? How can I find out more about the author?

What does the author say is the purpose of the site? What else might the author have in mind for the site? What makes the site easy to use? What information is included and does this information differ from other sites?

When was the site created? When was the site last updated?

Where does the information come from? Where can I find out more about the sponsor of the site?

Why is this information useful for my purpose? Why should I use this information? Why is this page better than another?



We have chosen the Utah Food Bank for our service project this year.



The Utah Food Bank works tirelessly with community partners and volunteers to continue making an impact and fulfilling their mission of Fighting Hunger Statewide.

One in 6 children in Utah face the pain and stress of hunger. Food deprived children not only feel the physical pain of an empty tummy, but when an empty tummy makes it hard to concentrate in school, it hurts their future too. Hungry children are more likely to be chronically absent from school, and when they do attend, they have a hard time concentrating. These children often feel powerless, afraid and hopeless, and all too often what little food they can access isn't enough to provide the nutrition their developing bodies need.

Our monetary donations, no matter how large or small, can help change this. For every \$1 donated, the Utah Food Bank can provide \$7.81 in goods and services. You can either donate at the time of registration or bring your donation to the conference. (If you want to use your donation for income tax purposes, bring your check, made out to the Utah Food Bank and we will mail it with the monies we collect as a group).
